David Colavecchio motioned and Roxy Fainer seconded to accept/approve all three steps of the tier package and reduce the budget to 2.029% overall increase as presented.

Discussion: Superintendent Coss stated that the cost in the budget for the School Psychologist position is \$70,304.00.

Frank Treglia asked what school the School Psychologist would be located at.

Superintendent Coss stated that the School Psychologist would be shared amongst the Elementary Schools and High School as needed.

Frank Treglia said that if the board takes out the Psychologist from the budget then it could look like the Board is not trying to protect the kids, and that he would like to leave the School Psychologist in the budget.

Maureen McMahon reiterated that she agreed.

Frank Treglia said that the Board would be taking out of the budget the safety and emotional wellbeing of our students.

Maureen McMahon does not think the position should be removed from the budget.

Jennifer Nolan agreed, stating not at the mental expense of the students.

Roxy Fainer asked if it was possible with all of the talk about security in the schools, that the Board could use grant money.

Superintendent Coss replied that she has not heard anything about grant money for mental health individuals as of yet or security personnel. **Superintendent Coss** explained that for security personnel, if the Board had one in each of the buildings and they were not a security guard; the amount would be between \$85,000.00 and \$100,000.00 for all three schools.

Scott Theriault asked what the title would be if not considered a security guard.

Superintendent Coss said it would be something without the word guard in it.

Scott Theriault said that a School Psychologist might spot a troubled individual and head something off before it happened as opposed to just battling something while it is happening.

David Colavecchio mentioned that it is his understanding that a security guard cannot touch a student.

Scott Theriault said a security guard would be a waste of money.

Frank Treglia reminded the Board that if the Board of Finance reducing the budget by say \$70,000.00, the Board of Finance is not saying where to take that \$70,000.00 out of the budget.

Superintendent Coss stating without the School Psychologist the budget is at 2.029%. **Superintendent Coss** also mentioned that the other item that the Board is waiting on is information on the Board of Education's Healthcare Broker.
