Dear Mrs. Coss and Thomaston Board of Education,

I am writing this letting in regards to Thomaston Center School's 5<sup>th</sup> grade class. At this time, I have concerns over the number of students that are in each classroom. From what is being reported there are 26-27 students in each academic class, homeroom, and specials class on any given day. My understanding is that this grade has had the highest out of district transfers this year of approximately 17 students. As a parent I am concerned with the quality of education that my child is receiving due to the influx of new students. The teachers are doing the best job that they can to accommodate the new higher number but also have to accommodate for 504 plans and IEP plans in the classroom.

This new dynamic in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade has only exacerbated the behavioral challenges in the classroom and the speed at which academic information can be taught. There is not special programming that I am aware of that will challenge students that are capable of advancing and understanding the material at a quicker rate. These students will eventually become bored with the educational process and unprepared for challenges when they enter into the 7<sup>th</sup> grade. There is also limited resources for the students that are struggling and need more academic and behavioral intervention at this time to be successful.

After presenting this information I am asking that you consider a few different things. The first thing is adding a fourth teacher for this class. This class will have 26-27 students in the classroom now until they get into high school. This number of students is unheard of for Thomaston and something you would usually see in very large school district. The next thing I am asking you to consider is to create programs that will challenge the students that traditionally do well. Challenging these students will allow them to be prepared for the future, decrease boredom with the education process and achieve higher test scores for the district.
